#### TRAINING CHECKLIST

Use this checklist and the CeQur Simplicity Quick Start Guide for training on the CeQur Simplicity Insulin Patch.

# PREPARE FOR TRAINING — HAVE THESE ITEMS READY:

- CeQur Simplicity Starter Kit
- Vial of rapid-acting insulin or sterile diluent to demonstrate the filling and priming process
- Alcohol wipes and sharps container
- Practice cushion

#### **Optional:**

- 1. Internet access if you would like to show the CeQur Simplicity Quick Start Guide Video
- 2. Other insulin or diabetes management training support materials

# The numbered sections on the checklist match those in the Quick Start Guide for easy identification of details to be covered.

### **Getting Started**

- Describe what the CeQur Simplicity Patch is used for and insulin brands approved for use with CeQur Simplicity
- Ensure patient acknowledges reading, or intends to read, the CeQur Simplicity User Guide and Quick Start Guide prior to using the CeQur Simplicity Patch

# 🔲 🕕 Prepare

- Name and show supplies to be gathered
- Explain and indicate the information to be checked on the Patch packaging
- Demonstrate steps to prevent infection
- Demonstrate opening the Patch packaging and removing the inner tray

## 2 Fill

- Explain how to determine length of time the Patch will be worn
- Explain the minimum and maximum fill amounts
- Calculate amount of rapid-acting insulin to fill the Patch based on daily dosage and 3-day maximum wear time
- Demonstrate attaching the capped needle to the Fill Syringe and filling the syringe
- Demonstrate filling the Patch, including proper syringe disposal

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#### 3 Prime

- Demonstrate removing air/bubbles from the Patch before priming
- Demonstrate priming the Patch by squeezing the Tan Buttons 4 more times

#### 4 Place Sticker

- Explain how to determine when the Patch should be replaced
- Demonstrate selecting the appropriate CHANGE BY Sticker and placing it on the Patch

# **5** Prepare Site

- Describe recommended sites, site rotation, position of the Patch on the body, and other points
- Describe products to avoid and steps to ensure adhesive performance
- Demonstrate site preparation to create a clean and dry site

#### 6 Place on Body

- Explain the purpose of the reusable Inserter and use of the Yellow Safety Button and Green Button
- Demonstrate placement of the Patch in the Inserter and explain warning not to unlock and press the Green Button until the Inserter is positioned properly on the body
- Demonstrate removal of the Blue Cap and plastic liner and explain warning not to point the Introducer Needle at the face or other people
- Demonstrate placement of the Patch on a practice cushion
- Demonstrate removal and proper disposal of the Red Cap
- Demonstrate how to secure the Patch following application with the Inserter

#### WHEN READY TO DOSE

- Explain 2 units are delivered each time the two buttons have been properly squeezed and a click is heard
- Explain counting by "2s" for dosing using the Dose Count Card as a reference
- Explain delivery of 1.7 units of insulin, instead of 2 units, on the first dose of a new Patch
- Demonstrate delivery of 8 units of insulin or other dose example
- Describe how to check the Patch daily to ensure proper attachment and timely replacement
- Explain for best adhesive performance to keep the Patch dry for several hours after application
- Demonstrate removal and disposal of the Patch

#### SAFETY FEATURES

- Explain that squeezing one button will not deliver any insulin
- Describe what to do when buttons lock and that the last squeeze of the buttons may have delivered less than 2 units
- Referencing the User Guide, discuss other Warnings, Cautions and Troubleshooting
